## **Our River Leven Community Fund (ORLCF)**

This Fund was designed, planned and delivered by the Levenmouth Connectivity Steering Group (LCSG)

The LCSG were originally responsible for the development of the Levenmouth (Behaviour Change) Community Action Plan and the ORLCF was designed to help resource local groups in order that they could take forward projects that aligned with community outcomes in the action plan.

Coalfields Regeneration Trust facilitated the process and applied for the funding of £50,000 from Sustrans via Green Action Trust and £30,000 from Fife Council giving a total fund size of £80,000

When the announcement was made at the close of the voting count that the funding available was short by a few thousand pounds to cover all the projects in full, it was suggested that if everyone accepted a bit less than they applied for then everyone could go home with their project funded. All the groups were unanimous in their agreement, meaning that everyone was a winner. A great day of community spirit in action!





#### A bit of background about the LCSG and the ORLCF PB Process

### **About the Levenmouth Connectivity Steering Group (LCSG)**

#### Mission statement of LCSG

To make the community's aspirations a reality leading to a more prosperous, healthier and attractive place to live, to learn and to work.

#### **Aims and Objectives**

The aim of the LCSG is to bring people together to discuss and ensure that the implementation of The Leven Connectivity Project Community Action Plan meets the needs and aspirations of the community.

### Membership

Members of the steering group are made up of local people and local representatives to meet with project representatives to help inform and influence major project decisions within Levenmouth related to the Leven Programme. By sharing your email you become a member of the group and will receive monthly minutes of meetings and any relevant updates relating to the LCSG. There is an open invitation to attend meetings either in person or on Zoom.

## **Purpose**

The steering group leads on a number of outcomes included in The Leven Connectivity Project (Behaviour Change) Community Action Plan and its main function is to help make these happen.

The Levenmouth Community Action Plan outcomes that the steering group lead on:

- Building the existing umbrella group with community representation at its core and fostering partnership working
- Create and promote an accessible and inclusive programme of leisure events / activities that allow people to connect with their area and the river area.
- Explore (social) history, heritage and nature and develop interpretation boards/murals and trails.

- Enhance opportunities for people to enjoy, learn about nature, wildlife, food growing and foraging.
- Create a programme of place making/art making.

#### Meetings

Meetings are held on a monthly basis usually in a local community centre, with accessibility in mind. Meetings can also be accessed on line through zoom. At meetings we share information and advice, it is a space where all voices are heard and are valued. Coalfields Regeneration Trust are the first point of contact as they are responsible for organising meetings and act as secretariat for the group.

#### **ORLCF Participatory Budget Process**

Regular meetings were held to discuss, design and deliver the PB process. It was agreed that the purpose of using a PB approach with a voting element was not just about deciding who gets the money, but also about bringing people together, creating a shared space for local groups to network and find out what is going on in the area. It also enabled local people to take part, have a voice in the decision making process and hopefully get more involved in local community activities, including the LCSG.

#### **Making the Fund Accessible**

The group designed the application form, using an existing CRT CIP fund application form as a template. It was created so as to be as simple as possible to apply for funding.

It was agreed that any individual with a good idea could apply for funding as long as they had a constituted group with a bank account that was happy to host the project.

It was agreed that funding applications would be accepted between £200 - £4,000

It was agreed that Funding Surgeries would be held in each of the communities. These ran from 3pm – 7pm and manned by CRT Staff. This enabled people to find out about the fund, what type of project was eligible for funding and if suitable they could access a funding application.

## **The Voting Event Venue**

It was agreed that we would use the new Wellesley Parish Church Hall and the event would be held on 27<sup>th</sup> January 2024, set up from 10am and voting 11am -1pm, results announced 1.30pm. Catering was provided by the hall with hot soup, sausage rolls and stovies.



Projects were invited to attend and put on a display to promote their project. To help 'level the playing field' regarding presentation, every group was given a display board that they could use to promote their project. Thanks go to Iglu Studios Ltd.who designed and delivered them.





Display boards were made available to all projects to complete and display. All but one group took them home!

#### Reaching out...

We created an online voting option as a way of reaching out to a wider audience, enabling people to vote who could not attend the live event. This option enabled people to vote within the same 2 hour time frame as the live event.

Thanks go to Fife College who kindly offered their support in producing the on line voting service. A sub group was set up to work on its design that included CRT, CLEAR, GAT and Fife College. A total of 1045 votes were registered on the voting platform!


## **Voting Results**
